RAMP Joint Transnational Call 2026

New funding available for raw materials research and innovation

Raw materials are essential for the green and digital transition. They are needed in technologies such as batteries and renewable energy systems. Growing demand, vulnerable supply chains and geopolitical uncertainty increase the need for sustainable and resilient raw materials systems.

The first Joint Transnational Call under the Raw Materials Partnership for the Green and Digital Transition (RAMP) is now open.

Indicative budget: Nearly €40 million

Application process: Two-stage process

1. Pre-proposal
2. Full proposal (by invitation only)

Pre-proposal deadline: 22 September 2026
